BEST OF THE BEST

It's relatively easy to define the best of the best in American racing. That's what the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association's American Graded Stakes Committee does each year, sifting through volumes of statistical data and then designating a select number of races with either grade I, II, or III ranking. In 2002 there were 486 graded races scheduled, 101 of them grade I, 155 grade IIs, and 230 grade IIIs. It's a system that's stood the test of time for 30 years.

In this annual review of graded stakes results, TBH MarketWatch points out which sires, broodmare sires, breeders, owners, consignors, sale companies, trainers, and geographic locations had the most success in producing racing's elite of 2002. The North American statistics featured here combine the American graded races with the 41 Canadian races graded by The Jockey Club of Canada.

Additional statistical lists include group races in all Northern Hemisphere countries for many of those same categories.

Perhaps most interesting of all the statistics is the battle for supremacy among sires of North American graded stakes winners (hereinafter referred to as

GSWs). For 2002 there is a six-way tie for the lead, with Dynaformer, French Deputy, Mr. Greeley, Sadler's Wells, Storm Cat, and Theatrical each siring five GSWs. The 2001 leader was Cozzene, with six; Theatrical topped the 2000 list with seven.

Looking strictly at the North American-based sires of grade I (G1) winners, the leaders, with three each, are Affirmed, Mr. Greeley, and Wild Again. Leaders in the previous two years were Seattle Slew in 2001 and A.P. Indy in 2000, with four each. (See a chart of the top sires on page 16.)

Globally, there is no contest as to which two sires dominated the graded/group rankings. Irish-based Sadler's Wells and Danehill rank one-two in both the graded/group and grade/group I standings. Sadler's Wells had 19 GSWs, with 10 of them G1. Incidentally, Sadler's Wells also is the leading sire of North American G1 winners with four. Danehill was close behind by GSWs with 15 and seven G1 winners. (Remember, these statistics are for Northern Hemisphere only.)

Cox's Ridge is the leading damsire of North American GSWs in 2002, with seven, edging Halo by

(Continued from page 1) one. Next, with five GSWs each, is an outstanding group of broodmare sires that includes Affirmed, Mr. Prospector, Nureyev, Seattle Slew, and Storm Bird. (Refer to page 16 for a chart of the leading dam sires of North American GSWs.). The seven GSWs from Cox's Ridge mares all come from different sires: Geiger Counter (sire of Nuclear Debate), Mane Minister (Bosque Redondo), Dixieland Band (Hook and Ladder), Broad Brush (Mongoose), Mt. Livermore (Orientate), Gone West (Westerly Breeze), and Phone Trick (Zavata). It's worth noting that the Broad Brush-Cox's Ridge cross has been extremely effective, producing five stakes winners thus far from 15 foals.

Expanding the 2002 statistics to include all graded/group races in the Northern Hemisphere puts Mr. Prospector on top with 10 GSWs, followed by Halo and Rainbow Quest, with nine each; and Affirmed, Dancing Brave, Miswaki, and Shirley Heights, with eight each.

Edward P. Evans, who has developed one of the most successful homebreeding operations in the world, bred the most North American GSWs of 2002. The Virginia-based breeder had eight GSWs, one more than the number bred by Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms, which led this category in 2000 and 2001. Third, with six, was Allen Paulson, followed by Canadian-based Sam-Son Farms and Orpendale and partners, five each. Evans also leads by G1 winners in America, with three; five breeders have two each, Allen Paulson, Flaxman Holdings, Orpendale, Payson Stud, and Sam-Son Farms.

From a worldwide standpoint, Juddmonte led the way with 20 graded/group winners. Sheikh Maktoum's Gainsborough is next, with 13, although the combination of the GSWs bred by Sheikh Mohammed (12) and his Darley Stud Management (4) exceeds the number bred by his oldest brother.

Who sold and bought the highest number of North American GSWs? Of the 172 offered at least once, 37 went through the ring as weanlings for an average hammer price of \$93,972; 134 as yearlings (average \$230,079), and 61 as 2-year-olds (average \$227,459). (The total exceeds 172 because of individual horses being offered at sale more than once.) Of the G1 winners offered at public auction, 5 were as weanlings (average \$301,046), 30 as yearlings (average \$233,464), and 13 as 2-year-olds (average \$220,692).

It's no surprise that the Keeneland September sale led as the No. 1 source of 2002 North American GSWs, with 68 having an average

hammer price of \$273,661. Fasig-Tipton's increasingly strong July sale was second in the GSW category among yearling sales, with 13, followed by Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga sale, 11, and Ocala Breeders' Sale Company's August sale, eight. It was not a good year for the Keeneland July sale, which produced just one North American GSW in 2002. Keeneland September offered the highest number of eventual North American G1 winners, too, with 20. FT Kentucky was second, with four.

Keeneland November completely dominated the weanling sale category, with 26 eventual GSWs of 2002 passing through the ring.


From a 2-year-old auction standpoint, it was all Florida, with Fasig-Tipton February and OBS March each producing nine 2002 GSWs, followed by OBS April with eight, and OBS February with four. California-based Barretts March and Fasig-Tipton's Maryland May sale each had three GSWs to lead the non-Florida auctions.

Taylor Made Sales Agency edged Eaton Sales, 15 to 14, in the number of 2002 North American GSWs consigned as yearlings. A quartet of 2-year-old consignors each with four GSWs offered—Robert Scanlon, Eddie Woods, Nick de Meric, and Niall Brennan Stables—led that category, and Eaton Sales edged Lane's End 4-to-3 to top the list of weanling consignors of eventual GSWs.

Four outfits consigned two or more G1 winners: Eddie Woods and Taylor Made each had three, and Denali Stud and Gainesway each had two.

Coolmore associate Demi O'Byrne was the leading buyer of North American GSWs, with six, followed at five by agent Buzz Chace, and four each by Sheikh Mohammed/Godolphin agent John Ferguson Bloodstock and The Thoroughbred Corp. Bargain shopper of the bunch was Chace, who spent an average of \$145,800 for the five GSWs, compared to \$2 million for Ferguson. O'Byrne also led with the most G1 winners bought, three.

Robert Frankel, hands down, was the leading trainer of North American GSWs and G1 winners, with 23 and seven, respectively.

Kentucky maintained its rank as the unmatched producer of top-quality runners. Of the 362 GSWs in North America, 211 (58%) were bred in Kentucky. Florida ranked second, with 37 (10%). Among North American G1 winners, Kentucky's dominance was even higher. Of the 74 G1 winners, 48 (65%) were bred in Kentucky. When all 145 Northern Hemisphere G1 races are considered, Ireland jumps up with 34, second on the list to Kentucky's 62.

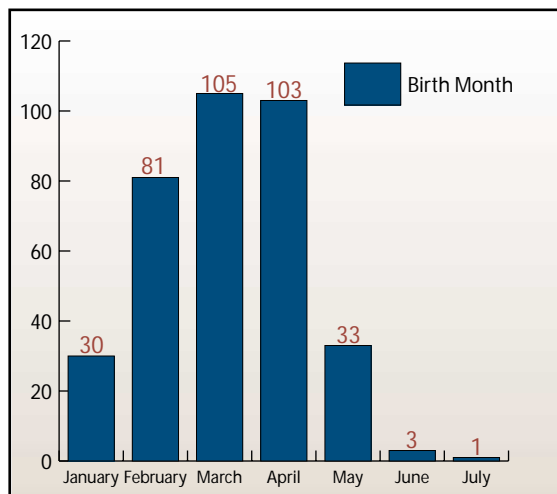

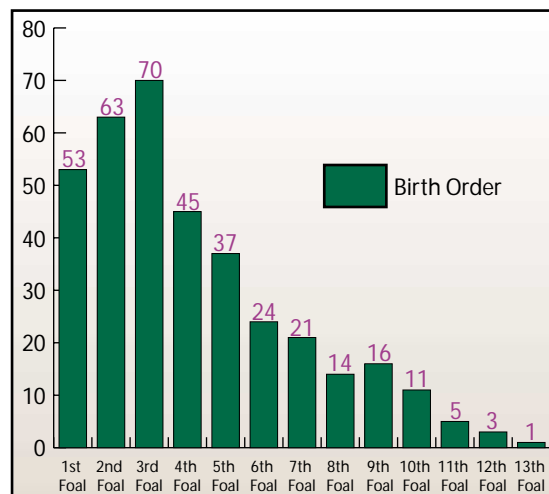

FRESHMAN SIRES TO WATCH

FORESTRY

One of the most salient facts in assessing this top 10 selection of freshmen sires is that four are sons of Storm Cat, with a fifth being a grandson. The other five are champions, either in America or abroad. That single fact illustrates how breeders perceive Storm Cat's best sons: they are the equivalent of champions.

Forestry, out of the Pleasant Colony mare Shared Interest, has the highest stud fee among this group by reason of his own race record, pedigree, and his good looks.

A good-sized horse standing nearly 16.2 hands, Forestry won seven of his 11 starts. His most important victories came in the King's Bishop Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga, in which he defeated Five Star Day, Successful Appeal, Vicar, and

Doneraile Court, and in the Dwyer Stakes (gr. II), at Belmont over Doneraile Court. The bay horse also ran third to Menifee and Cat Thief in the Haskell Invitational Handicap (gr. I).

Although Forestry earned \$591,225, his victory in a grade one race was worth more, as it made him the second winner at that level produced by grade one winner Shared Interest. She is also the dam of Cash Run, by Seeking the Gold, and that filly won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (gr. I).

Shared Interest is one of two grade one winners from her dam, the Dr. Fager mare Surgery, and the latter is one of eight winners from the Bold Ruler mare Bold Sequence, who is a half sister to Mr. Prospector's dam Gold Digger.

If Forestry needed further qualifications, he is a handsome horse who stands over a good deal of ground, clearly getting some added scope from the influence of Pleasant Colony and Dr. Fager.--F.M.

EXPLOIT

It is of considerable credit to the influence of Storm Cat and the marketing of Taylor Made that Exploit, who did not win or place at grade I level, was able to retire to stud at a fee of \$30,000. Not only did he attract a book of mares that had the second highest class index (CI) of any contemporary first-season stallion, but the resultant crop then achieved the second highest yearling average--for new sires--of \$140,000 from 52 sold. As a juvenile, Exploit was unbeaten in four starts that included a victory in the Brown & Williamson Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (gr. II). He only appeared twice at three, winning in the seven-furlong San Vicente Stakes (gr. II) and

placing second to Prime Timber in the San Felipe Stakes (gr. II), after which he had to be retired. A half brother to five stakes winners, including the 1989 Breeders' Cup Turf (gr. IT) winner Prized, he is a medium-sized, strong and precocious horse that fits the mold of a desirable commercial sire. With crops of 85 and 78 in his first two years, he will be expected to--and will need to--get off to a good start as his support is built on reputation and expectation.--M.Y.

MENIFEE

One has to wonder what Menifee might have been had injury not sidelined him as a juvenile. He followed a 3 1/2-length debut victory with a 3-length allowance victory over seven furlongs at Saratoga His victims: Cat Thief and Lemon

Drop Kid! A bone chip then sidelined him for six months. It could be argued his bad luck followed him as a three year old. Charismatic won the Kentucky Derby (gr. I) by a neck from the late charging Menifee. In the Preakness (gr. I), Menifee could not reverse the form and again placed second to Charismatic—who went on to take three-year-old and Horse of the Year titles. His classic efforts were book-ended by a pair of grade I wins in the Blue Grass Stakes and Haskell Invitational Handicap, both at the expense of Cat Thief, who subsequently won the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I). Menifee is a son of 1994 Vosburgh Stakes (gr. I) winner Harlan (by Storm Cat) and the stakes-winning Halo mare, Anne Campbell (by Never Bend), who was Broodmare of the Year in 1999. Anne Campbell also produced Hollywood Gold Cup (gr. I) winner Desert Wine and Mr. P's Princess, the dam of champion 2-year-old colt Fasliyev. Being a horse with scope, one should not expect Menifee's stock to be precocious. Still it is somewhat surprising that breeders have not afforded him better support considering his excellent yearling average of \$98,000 and median of \$74,500. His first crop numbers of 37 and 48 are likely to disadvantage him early, but he is a horse with solid credentials.--M.Y.

ARTAX

As a physical specimen, Artax can compete with any horse. He is an athlete of admirable dimensions, and only Silver Charm and Horse Chestnut can compete with him for power. Of those, Artax was notably the speediest, while Silver Charm and Horse Chestnut carried their speed classic distances.

A champion sprinter and winner of the Breeders' Cup Sprint (gr. I), Artax has an uncommon length of shoulder and depth of girth. This is well balanced by his long hip, which has strong muscling down the length of his hind leg, as well as great width and development across his back and hips.

He has a good neck and head, which work well with his length through the body. Yet despite the mass of his body, Artax was a successful racer from ages 2 through 4, winning a half-dozen stakes at distances up to a mile and a sixteenth and developing into a champion sprinter in his final season.

Artax is by Marquetry, a winner of nearly \$3 million by Horse of the Year Conquistador Cielo, and Marquetry has sired two winners of the Breeders' Cup Sprint. The other is Squirtle Squirt.--F.M.

MAZEL TRICK

Mazel Trick started his career in the French provinces, winning two of three starts as a juvenile. A transfer to California led to two victories at three, including a win in the 1 1/16-mile Lazaro S. Barrera Handicap (gr. III). Handled by Bobby Frankel, he was blossoming into a top-class older horse before injury forced retirement. He had scored a six-length victory in the San Diego Handicap (gr. III) and had captured a seven-furlong track record in the Triple Bend Breeders' Cup Invitational Handicap (gr. II), which he won by five lengths. It was no secret that Frankel was very high on the horse and considered him a serious contender for some of California's major graded events. A son of Phone Trick, Mazel Trick is a half brother to

Freshman Sire Review

1994 Hopeful Stakes (gr. I) winner Wild Escapade. He is out of the grade III winner Mazatleca (Mex) whose family has produced few other notable performers. The Airdrie-based Mazel Trick, who has hocks that stand out behind him, has a good-sized first crop of 90. They were well received with 50 yearlings selling for an average of \$79,000 and median of \$53,500. With 66 foals in his second crop and 104 mares bred in the third year, he should have some sustained support to come.--M.Y.

STRAVINSKY

The much-vaunted Stravinsky, though trained in Ireland, made a memorable debut in England. He won at six furlongs after accelerating through a narrow gap along the rail. His subsequent appearances as a juvenile in two seven-furlong tests, unfortunately, weren't as striking. He ran second in the Prix de la Salamandre (Fr-I), but was disqualified and placed last. He then ran third in the Dewhurst Stakes (Eng-I). Two more disappointing efforts at the beginning of his three-year-old year followed before a return to six furlongs revitalized his racing career. Stravinsky annihilated a field of older sprinters in track record time in the July Cup (Eng-I) at Newmarket. He unleashed another powerful burst to clear a wall of horses in the five-furlong Nunthorpe Stakes (Eng-I) where he defeated Sainte Marine. Sadly he did not reproduce that form in the Breeders Cup Sprint (gr. I) and went unplaced. The Sprint was his last race. A well-bred horse by Nureyev, he is from the grade I winning Fire the Groom, by Blushing Groom, and has Kentucky Oaks (gr. I) winner Native Street as his third dam. Like all Coolmore stallions, he was very active in the breeding shed. He had 48 yearlings sell for an average of \$76,800 and median of \$52,000, but his fee has been reduced from \$35,000 in 1999 to half that in 2003. Like another excellent European sprinter Dayjur, he may struggle to make his mark in North America. Not only was he a turf performer, but also the opportunities for five- to six-furlong sprinters are relative scarce. Relocation to Ireland would not be surprising.--M.Y.

HORSE CHESTNUT

A really strong-looking horse with balance and some quality, Horse Chestnut is the best South African-bred racer since Hawaii, and it is very intriguing that he stands at the same farm that stood Hawaii-Claiborne. Only once beaten in 10 starts, Horse Chestnut ran himself out of competition in his homeland.

In the J & B Met, he defeated older horses by more than eight lengths, and Horse Chestnut had earlier slaughtered horses of his own age by 10 lengths in the South African Derby. In his only start in America, Horse Chestnut won the Broward Handicap (gr. III) rather handily by five and a half lengths, but an injury shortly thereafter forced his retirement.

Priced at \$10,000, Horse Chestnut is one of the two least expensive stallions in this group, but his racing class and very appealing physique drew support from Kentucky breeders. Last year, they were rewarded when 20 of Horse Chestnut's yearlings averaged more than \$70,000, with a median price of \$50,000.

Horse Chestnut is by the group one winner Fort Wood, one of the best-pedigreed sires in the world as he is by the premier European stallion Sadler's Wells and is one of nine stakes winners out of Fall Aspen.--F.M.

SILVER CHARM

A good-looking, masculine horse with very good conformation, Silver Charm was the champion of his crop at 3 and 4, winning 11 stakes, including the Kentucky Derby, Preakness, Dubai World Cup, Strub (all gr. I), and earning almost \$7 million.

A major winner each year he raced, Silver Charm showed much more precocity than his pedigree suggested. The horse defeated Gold Tribute and Swiss Yodeler in the Del Mar Futurity (gr. II), winning two of his three starts.

By the Buckpasser stallion Silver Buck, Silver Charm is one of more than three dozen stakes winners by his sire. Bred and raced by C.V. Whitney, Silver Buck was from one of Whitney's premium families, and despite showing his own best form over nine and 10 furlongs as a mature horse, Silver Buck has sired a respectable percentage of 2-year-old winners (22 percent) and stakes winners at that age.

The dam of Silver Charm is the Poker mare Bonnie's Poker, who was a very sturdy racehorse. Her sire was exceptionally well bred, being by Round Table out of the Nasrullah mare Glamour from the La Troienne family, and is the broodmare sire of Seattle Slew.--F.M.

TACTICAL CAT

Tactical Cat was tall as juvenile, probably an influence from his broodmare-sire Caro, but size never hindered his early ability. He won a 4 1/2-furlong maiden race by seven lengths at Keeneland in April. In all he started nine times at two. He won the Tremont Stakes and the 8 1/2-furlong Hollywood Futurity (gr. I) over Prime Timber and produced four stakes-placed efforts. He had just three starts the following season with only an allowance victory and a third place effort in the Ack Ack Handicap (gr. III) to his credit. Both his first two dams are stakes winners, with the second, Mia Dancer, being a Marshua's River half sister to Skip Away's sire Skip Trial. Priced at \$10,000 by Overbrook, the son of Storm Cat was well supported, but he has a class index that trails some of the other sires in this review. Tactical Cat had 70 first crop foals with 45 selling as yearlings for an average of \$60,800 and a median of \$40,000. The second crop number 48, but he covered 124 mares in his third year. Whilst Tactical Cat may not have been the most sought-after son of Storm Cat to retire to stud, the achievements of Harlan, Forest Wildcat and Storm Boot indicate that not all sons of Storm Cat need to be outstanding performers to become successful stallions.--M.Y.

STORMIN FEVER

One of the handsomest sons of Storm Cat, Stormin Fever was an extremely fast racehorse, repeatedly earning Beyer Speed Figures greater than 110. Yet two of his best performances were losses. It took one of Skip Away's gamest efforts to

defeat him in the Iselin Handicap (gr. II) by a nose, and his second in the Vosburgh Stakes (gr. I) the same year put him ahead of Tale of the Cat, Distorted Humor, and Kelly Kip.

For all his typical Storm Cat power, Stormin Fever has considerable quality and finesse. He has a good head, good shoulder and hindquarters, pleasing length through the body, and an adequate balance of mass to bone. For all his speed, he is not built like a horse that had to sprint.

Stormin Fever's full sister is the top-quality racemare Raging Fever, who has been among the best of her age since her juvenile season. Their dam is Pennant Fever, a daughter of Seattle Slew and the Bold Forbes mare Letty's Pennant, a half sister to champion Sacahuista and major winner Far Flying. The fourth dam is the great broodmare Nalee.--F.M.

PINHOOKERS CRITIQUE FRESHMAN SIRES

TBH MarketWatch has regularly interviewed top 2-year-old pinhookers about the progeny of freshman sires they like. While they all have scrutinized young horses at auctions across the country, the pinhookers are quick to say they are most familiar with the horses represented in their barns. Still even the ones they liked as yearlings have changed and their abilities as runners has only recently begun to show. The following is their observations.

Eddie Woods, Ocala, Fla.

FAVORITES: Forestry, Mazel Trick, Exploit, Tactical Cat.

SLEEPER: El Amante

"Forestrys are stylish. Nearly all of them are good-size, elegant, well-made horses. They have a bit of that Storm Cat (hard-headedness), which is good as long as it's turned in the right direction. Mazel Trick—they are just nice. They are classy and good movers.. Exploit, again, are good movers. They are well-balanced horses with quite a bit of Storm Cat in them. Our Tactical Cat looks like he wants to be really, really fast."

SLEEPER: "El Amante. They are really good moving horses for a cheapy stallion." (El Amante stands at Rio Medina Ranch near San Antonio, Texas, for a \$2,000 stud fee.)

be surprised if he didn't pass on that speed to his progeny. Mazel Tricks look like they will come out running and come out running early. They are well-balanced with a good hip and shoulder. They have that heavy, blocky musculature that you associate with that sire line but they seem scopy enough to offset that."

SLEEPER: "Crafty Friend. I have a colt that is big but very coordinated and well put together. He looks like he'll have some speed and be able to go two turns."

J.B. McKathan, Citra, Fla.

FAVORITES: Silver Charm, Forestry, Exploit, Tactical Cat.

SLEEPER: Crafty Friend.

"I am loving the Silver Charms right now. They are working beautifully. Each one has a really efficient way of moving. Many of the best ones we've seen, we've bought so we may have a better group of Silver Charms than most. I don't consider him a freshman sire leader, but you just can't end it at the end of their 2-year-old year. I am also liking both Forestry and Exploit. They are a coin toss like the Touch Gold and Awesome Again argument. I guess we'll have to let them work it out on the track. The Forestrys probably had a little more size early on, but the Exploits are catching up. Exploits were a little typier horse earlier. I like Tactical Cat and wound up with five of them in the barn even though I didn't set out to do that. They are all training well. They are really attractive horses and they didn't bring crazy money."

SLEEPER: "Crafty Friend. I have a couple of them that act they can be fast. He was a stone sprinter and they usually take off and become the good 2yo sires."

"The ones I have by Artax are fast learners and precocious. They are great movers. They are push-button, really. We have some by Stravinsky that are well along. They have already breezed twice. Everyone is going on about Mazel Trick. They are fast and early and are well put together. They have done everything I have asked them to do. Plus they have great dispositions. Another horse I like, but I don't know if they have enough gas, is Silver Charm. They are well put together, and they will be good later in the year. Stravinskys are a little bigger than you would imagine in a sprinter. They are big boned but they seem to be athletic, too."

SLEEPER: "Horse Chestnut. I remember him as a racehorse and thought he was any kind of horse before he broke down."

All three of my Tactical Cats are real aggressive and want to go. They were all very obnoxious. Still, I bred to the horse in addition to buying some babies. They are taller, stretchier, leggier Storm Cats. You can see the Caro in them. The Stormin Fevers are more Storm Cat-looking, thicker. The Mazel Tricks are all very bright."

SLEEPER: "This is an oddity, but I have two Sea of Secrets that are very fast. He won't have the numbers like Tactical Cat, but we're selling one at Barretts and one at Fasig-Tipton, and I think they will work very well. We buy based on individuals. One of the Sea of Secrets is very athletic and really pretty. The other one you look at and you don't understand why he's fast."

He was one of the fastest horses of the decade, and I would

MARES MAKE THE DIFFERENCE

A young stallion has no prayer of being successful without a strong band of broodmares backing him up. So after listening to all the hype from stallion managers about earnings and margin of victories in graded stakes, go look at who is covering the best runners and producers.

Forestry is the undisputed leader among freshman sires of 2003 when judged by the quality of mares bred. Like a young prince, the handsome bay son of top sire Storm Cat was born to lead. He is the first foal out of grade I winner Shared Interest and as a yearling brought \$1.5 million at the 1997 Keeneland July select sale. The prince didn't disappoint when sent off to battle. Forestry earned \$591,225 and won the King's Bishop (gr. I) at seven furlongs and the Dwyer Stakes (gr. II) at 1 1/16 miles.

When he retired to stud at Taylor Made Farm, Forestry attracted the best group of mares as determined by two key indicators—the class performance index (CPI) and the comparable index (CI). The CPI indicates how well a mare did as a racehorse by comparing her average earnings per start with other female runners of her age in the same country. A horse with an average earnings equal to the average of her peers would have a CPI of 1.00. The CI indicates a mare's quality as a producer by comparing the performance of her offspring by a given sire with her offspring by different sires. Better mares have higher CIs because they consistently produce runners regardless of her offspring's sire.

During his first season at stud, Forestry covered mares with the highest CPI and highest CI of any member of his stallion class. The CI for mares that delivered his first crop in 2001 was 4.68, almost a full point higher than the 3.71 CI for **Event of the Year**, the second leading freshman sire when ranked by this index for 2001. The CPI for Forestry's first group of mares was 4.91. **Silver Charm** ranked a close second with a CPI of 4.81.

The adage "breed the best to the best and hope for the best" worked for the breeders who supported Forestry. Commercially, they were rewarded with the highest weanling average price among the freshman sire class of 2003. Eight weanlings sold for an average \$257,500. Forestry led his sire class again in 2002 by yearling average (\$248,766) and median (\$160,000) for 32 sold. The strong auction results have kept breeders with the better mares coming back. Forestry topped the list of freshman sires by CI and CPI for 2002 with indices of 3.57 and 5.88,

respectively. As for the hopes of seeing 2-year-old winners show up early, Forestry again has a statistical edge. More than half the mares he was bred to his first season won as 2-year-olds and 19% went on to produce 2-year-old winners.

California sire Event of the Year was the only other stallion to rank consistently among the top five freshman sires when ranked by CI and CPI for 2001 and 2002.

As mentioned previously, the son of Seattle Slew ranked second by 2001 CI and third by 2001 CPI with a 4.69. The quality of Event of the Year's offspring as weanlings is hard to judge since only one sold publicly in 2001 and four in 2002. More were sold as yearlings (21) for an average \$31,600, which was a harsh number compared to Event of the Year's \$40,000 stud fee in 2000. However, with the backing of Betty Mabee's Golden Eagle Farm, Event of the Year continues to get strong support. He ranked third among freshman sires with a 2002

CI of 2.63 and third by 2002 CPI with a 4.56.

Another regular at the top of 2003 freshman sire rankings is 1997 3-year-old champion Silver Charm. The son of Silver Buck attracted a group of mares that could run his first season as indicated by his 2001 CPI of 4.81. They were also a proven band of producers with a CI of 2.77. In 2002, the mares he was bred to were collectively weaker on the racing side and stronger on the producing side. The CPI for mares bred to him that foaled in 2002 slipped to 3.59 but their CI rose to 3.09, which placed Silver Charm second to Forestry by 2002 CI. Silver Charm's first crop of weanlings that sold at auction didn't create much of a stir. Nine weanlings, bred on a \$25,000 stud fee, averaged \$37,244. His offspring offered as yearlings fared better much better, averaging \$83,063 for 40 sold. The second crop of weanlings, the ones out of the group of better producing mares, also did better at auction. Silver Charm's 2002 weanlings averaged \$66,250, making him the third leading freshman sire by weanling average for last year.

Some juvenile pinhookers said while they expect Silver Charm to be a solid sire, they are not expecting to see him near the top of the freshman sire leader board this year. While he won the Del Mar Futurity (gr. II) at 2, he was better at 3 and 4. Silver Charm's first group of mares could help provide some of his offspring with early speed. Among the mares who delivered Silver Charm foals in 2001, 29% were winners at 2 and 16.5% produced juvenile winners. (Continued on page 10)

Graded stakes winner **Exploit** has been a sire to watch because the son of Storm Cat has been drifting around the upper freshman sires rankings by CPI and CI for 2001 and 2002. He got placed solidly in the limelight, however, after his first crop of sale weanlings averaged \$154,000, ranking him second by this statistic to Forestry. Exploit, who also stands at Taylor Made Farm, was second again to Forestry by 2002 yearling average (\$137,797 for 53 sold) and by 2002 weanling average (\$79,667 for six sold).

Several top juvenile pinhookers have described the Exploit offspring in their barns as precocious and are showing signs of early speed. Like Forestry, Exploit got some help from his first group of broodmares of which more than a third won as 2 year olds and 16% have produced juvenile winners.

Count **Horse Chestnut** among the horses to keep an eye on this year. The South African-bred son of group I winner Fort Wood, backed by mares with a solid 2001 CI (1.84) and CPI (2.78), produced an outstanding first crop. His 2001 sale weanlings averaged \$64,667 (for three sold) and his yearlings averaged \$73,735 (for 20 sold) or 7.37 times his initial stud fee of \$10,000. These yearlings could easily carry their sales successes to the track since their dams produced the greatest percentage of 2-year-old winners compared with the mares bred to other freshman sires. The 39 mares bred to Horse Chestnut in 2001 have already produced 156 foals, of which 40 (26%) became winners as 2-year-olds. Five of those 2-year-olds, 3.2%, became stakes winners. Claiborne Farm's Horse Chestnut is among the top 10 freshman sires by 2002 CI (1.92) and 2002 CPI (3.61).


Other horses to watch are **Tactical Cat**, **Mazel Trick**, and **Stormin Fever**. Tactical Cat is another son of Storm Cat who appears to be producing some hard-headed, but tenacious offspring. He had a good CI of 2.00 and a CPI of 2.71 for 2001, and his progeny were well received at auction. He ranked seventh among freshman sires by 2001 weanling average (\$65,750) and 10th by 2002 yearling average (\$60,816). Tactical Cat stands for \$10,000 at Overbrook Farm.

Mazel Trick may not have the most fashionable pedigree, but his first foal crop is backed by solid producing mares. While he ranked 18th among freshman sires by 2001 CPI, these same mares placed him fifth by CI. They apparently threw a smart bunch of athletic horses that buyers clamored for as weanlings and yearlings.

Mazel Trick was the sixth leading first-crop sire by 2001 weanling average (\$75,746), the sixth leading sire by 2002 yearling average (\$79,024), and the seventh leading sire by 2002 weanling average (\$47,182). The first mares bred to Mazel Trick also have shown an affinity for producing 2-year-old winners. Out of 416 foals, this group has produced 93 (22%) 2-year-old winners and 20 (4.8%) 2-year-old stakes winners. Mazel Trick stands for \$12,500 at Airdrie Stud.

Stormin Fever wasn't among the top 10 freshman in 2001 with a modest 1.35 CI and despite a relatively strong 2.99 CPI. Like Airdrie stallion barnmate Mazel Trick,

however, his status was elevated at the yearling sales, particularly the Fasig-Tipton new sire showcase last July where he was the second-leading freshman sire by average. Six of his yearlings averaged \$176,667. Exploit was the leading freshman sire by average (\$185,714) at the Fasig-Tipton sale and Mazel Trick (\$169,250) was third. For the entire year, Stormin Fever is the 10th leading freshman sire with an average of \$70,385.

Artax, **Meniffee**, and **Stravinsky** are others who rank among the leaders by either broodmare indices or sales results. Champion sprinter Artax is the fifth leading sire with a 2.26 CI for 2002. He also ranked fifth by 2002 weanling average (\$54,167) and seventh by yearling average (\$74,771) last year. Stone Farm's Meniffee is the fourth-leading freshman sire by 2002 CPI with a 3.73 and he just missed the top 10 with a 1.76 CI for the same year. He is the third leading freshman sire by yearling average (\$98,356) and the sixth leading sire by weanling average (\$48,286) last year. Ashford Stud's Stravinsky has regularly been among the top 10 sires of his class by CI and CPI. For 2002, he had a 1.98 CI and a 3.67 CPI. His yearlings and weanlings also were well received. Stravinsky is the fifth-leading sire by yearling average (\$81,237) and the four leading sire by weanling average (\$54,372).
